

How to Recycle Glass for Manufacturers (or Large Companies)

The global market for recycled glass surrounds Asia-Pacific, Latin America, Europe, North America, the Middle East, and Africa. The global glass market is projected to grow to approximately \$5.27 billion by 2027.

#### **Materials Accepted**<sup>1</sup>

Glass is recyclable! Any kind of glass except windshields, ceramics, lightbulbs, and decorative glass that has been painted, colored, or has foiling on it cannot be recycled.
Please note: This is a general list for this commodity. For a more detailed look, please contact your recycler to confirm what they are able to accept.

### How to Recycling Glass: Questions a Recycling Company May Ask

- What type of glass?
- Is the material tempered?
- Is the material ceramic?
- What's your monthly volume?
- Can your business sort the glass by color, if requested?
- Ooes your business have space to store the material?
- Could you use this material back into your process as raw material?
- Ooes your business have any interest in reusing the martial back into your process?

Pictures and/or samples of the material(s) are always helpful, and will likely be requested.

# **How to Recycle Properly**

- $\diamond$  ~ Rinse out material and make sure it has no food contaminates.
- Labels are okay.
- Dual Stream is highly recommended, if possible.

- ◊ Countertops
- ♦ Glass backsplashes and glassphalt.<sup>2</sup>
- Ingredient in concrete and roadway reflective paint, ceramic tiles, fiberglass, picture frames, friction for matches and ammunition, abrasives for sand-blasting, and replace sand on beaches that have been impacted by erosion.<sup>3</sup>
